

Queen Ada Ann Watson-Hood, born on October 12, 1924, she emerged as the eldest among her siblings—two sisters and a brother. Transitioning from the South to the North during her early teens marked a significant chapter in her life.

Despite facing challenges, she bore a gentle yet determined spirit, possessing a remarkable ability to propel progress.

As an entrepreneur, she grasped the significance of nurturing INSPIRED DREAMS.

Missouri was born in Saint Michaels Hospital, Newark, New Jersey, on October 5, 1956 and is the third youngest of seven siblings, 1 sister and 5 brothers. God is the source of her life, her mother "Ada" is the force in her life and her children are the wind beneath her wings.

1965 a small beating heart became alive, a rebirth one would say, how fitting it would happen on Christmas day! — says the Story Teller.

It was 1965 when Missouri's Mother, "Ada" gave her a Barbie Doll for Christmas. Using remnants from her mother's sewing baskets, young Missouri designed and hand made her Barbie a complete wardrobe.

She proceeded to give her mother a cardboard runway fashion show on the dining room table, as she played gospel music in the background. "Mother loved gospel music." – says Missouri

After the show she looked up at her mother and said, One day I am going to do a BIG Show." Her mother patted her on the head and said, sure your will child...sure your will.

In that moment young Missouri could feel the electricity from her mother's hand on her head and she knew one day she really would do the "BIG Show"...

I'm Victoria Zelin-Cloud. You can find my bio on LinkedIn, but here is my life in terms of some of the transformations, or paradigm shifts I've experienced. Each has opened me up to new levels of awareness, competence, compassion and satisfaction.

My first transformation was in The Landmark Forum, then called "the best training." I learned that, like everyone else, I had "a story" or interpretation about—well, everything!

At the time, I despised my dad and was hoping for a breakthrough. In listening to other people's complaints and realizing that they were trapped in their own "story," I had a flash of recognition. I saw my father newly and fell in love with him! Life changed dramatically. I was more curious than judgmental. After a lot of courses, training and practice, I was invited to join a small management consulting firm that licensed Landmark's work. I became a superstar at "enrolling" business leaders and was in heaven for many years.

Meanwhile, I met my husband, got married, had our daughter, and lived for 10 years in Ottawa, Canada. We moved back to NJ to be near the company's main office, but I couldn't recapture my passion for the job. When I left the company, they paid for a career coach, which led to my next transformation. My coach said that I was a master of sales! Since I had never seen myself as having a profession, let alone a sales career, this opened all kinds of possibilities. Sales was a good fit. I did well and was happy.

In 1998, I met Missouri at a Landmark event and hired her to upgrade my wardrobe. The process and the outcome transformed my life, my clothes, my mindset and even my aspirations. She dressed me so I looked like the straight shooter that I was, the confident woman who spoke truth to power.

This generated an upward spiral of accomplishments and satisfaction, to the pinnacle of my sales career, working for Deloitte, one of the most prestigious consulting firms in the world.

Over the last decade, our small nonprofit, Possible Planet, introduced and pushed through a transformative law in NJ. This fall, NJ's Economic Development Authority is implementing C-PACE (Commercial Property Assessed Clean Energy), making it profitable for commercial property owners to "go green" through an unprecedented financing program.

My most recent transformation is becoming a bioregionalism. Studying with Joe Brewer in his Design School for Regenerating Earth has shifted my thinking about how nature and community is the path for the human race to thrive, given climate change. My husband planted a food forest at our home in Rochester. I'd never have predicted it, but I went from never going outside to being delighted in observing nature, tending our fruit and nut trees, and planting native pollinator plants.

The Enlightened Journey of a Black, Flat, and Proud Woman

My journey of who I am as a breast cancer thriver has taken me on an enlightened path of self-awareness and growth, to one where I am now walking in the full bloom of my authenticity. I remember going into my GYN doctor's office in 2015 to hear the diagnosis that could not be relayed over the phone. "You have stage zero cancer!" What! To be completely honest with you, I never even knew there was a stage zero cancer diagnosis. After getting clarification and developing a plan of action with my oncologist, I had a lumpectomy and 33 treatments of radiation, which was the standard treatment for women rowing in my part of the water. After my treatment, I would not have to deal with THIS inconvenience anymore, especially now that I was well on my way to completing my dissertation and preparing for graduation, or so I thought. Through many prayers and heart-to-heart talks with my Lord, I moved through the treatment regiment, defended my dissertation, and graduated. However, if you want to make God laugh; make plans, which saw my cancer returning in the same breast less than a year after graduating with my Ph.D. Knowing that I did not want to have to go through the same cycle of treatment again, I elected to have both "Girls" removed, and have officially immersed myself in the "itty bitty no titty committee" for life or as I like to call myself a member of the "Flat Brigade."

I love walking in my authenticity and embracing the beautiful woman that I am, so much so that I have had the essence of who I am captured as art that lives and breathes where my "Girls" once proudly sat.

Breast Cancer Journey

I guess I'll start from the very beginning. I was out visiting my friend in Texas in January 2021, we had a couple drinks and I had admitted to her I had this weird feeling that I was going to get breast cancer and or I had already had it. My mom had had it about 10 years ago when she was 53. She asked me why and I would've never said the word, "aura" or "presence" in a sentence before pertaining to my life; but this is exactly, what it felt like over my left side of my upper body. I finally got the nerve to do a self-exam once I got home but not until April. I was too scared I would find something but the feeling kept getting stronger. To my dismay I did indeed find a round pea size lump on my left breast. I made an appointment with my GYN doctor and he did find two lumps, the one I also felt, but he indeed another my armpit. A mammogram followed, and then a biopsy. Troy my husband, was gone this week I was expected to receive results. He was hesitant to go, but I told him to go anyways. I remember where I was in the parking lot of the library with my two girls in the backseat 1 and 2 years old when she gave me the news. My initial consultation with the surgical oncologist I was hopeful I just needed surgery not chemo. Although I was told I do indeed need chemo as well, for the first time I lost, THIS made things real. Radiation was planned to follow.

June 1, 2021 was my first day of chemo, this was after a long 1.5-month egg retrieval process. At the time we weren't sure we were having any more kids or not so decided to have eggs frozen. Yet this was a long, exhausting and stressful process considering

I knew this was delaying my chemo start date. The anxiety of knowing the cancer was growing inside me riddled me with anxiety and insomnia every day.

I wanted to normalize my life as much as I could for my kids and my husband, so after a lot of thought, we opted to do cold caps and attempt to keep my hair through this process. Every three weeks Troy would drive 40 minutes away to go get dry ice for the caps. It was frigid and gave my husband a purpose in a world he felt helpless. The first chemo was alright, there was a lot of GI symptoms, anxiety, and fear of the unknown. Although, after my second treatment, I ended up at the hospital with a sustained heart rate of 35 bpm, weakness and elevated liver enzymes. They did a whole cardiac workup and monitored my labs daily. At the time I wasn't worried somewhat due to my medical background although I know everyone else was. My doctor recommended changing my regimen at that time which included a lot less side effects considering my insurance would pay for it now that I couldn't tolerate the first one. I remember a lot of bad leg and pain neuropathy and weakness; my legs would buckle when I would go down stairs. I also recall a lot of rashes, night Itching, and weight loss.

I had the most amazing support system thy had a food train going and would bring us meals each week and helped watch the kids. Looking back, I am not sure how we did it, we would have been even more of a mess without them. My husband had to drop

out of MBA school early to help me through this. He was my rock and stayed positive 100% of the time. I finally completed surgery with exploratory lymph node dissection and double mastectomy with expanders placed October 2021 and had found out I had a total pathologic response which means they didn't find any cancer left over. There were many complications and infections after surgery, including a week stay at Fox Chase Cancer Center for IV antibiotics and removal of one expander for 5 months. I had one breast that was stretched for expansion for future placement of implants and one flat breast, I used a prosthetic device to cover this. The other expander was finally placed 4 months later which was followed by once-a-week saline fills with a large needle to stretch the skin till they could fit a small implant. It was a tautness to it plus sore a few days after each injection. Finally, July 2022 I had real implants placed. I had gotten 5 different opinions regarding radiation and it was a 50/50 split half saying I should get it and half saying I didn't need it considering how well the chemo worked. I opted out of doing radiation at the time considering this did come with a number of short- and long-term side effects. I finished my Herceptin in June 2022 having it for one year, this medication has harsh effects on the heart so continued cardiac echoes will continue through the next 5 years as well as 10 years of Tamoxifen. Tamoxifen is used to help reduce the risk of triple positive breast cancer from returning, this drug has side effects similar to going through menopause.




DIONNE GABBIDON'S JOURNEY

I was diagnosed with invasive ductal carcinoma, stage two breast cancer, on November 14th, 2022. It all began when I experienced sharp pains in my right breast. My gynecologist attributed it to my monthly cycle, but after feeling lumps in my breast, I requested a mammogram. Unfortunately, the script I received was incorrectly coded, and despite multiple requests for a new one, I was told it was "good enough" when it wasn't.

I sought a second opinion, and even though the doctor didn't feel anything, I insisted on getting the mammogram. After that, things escalated quickly: I was called for an ultrasound, followed by a biopsy. I was terrified. When the results came back positive for cancer, I rushed to my doctor's office, where he simply apologized, admitting he didn't think it was anything serious.

In shock, I knew I had to mentally prepare myself. I screamed, then immediately asked, "How do I get ahead of this? What can I do to beat cancer?" My first oncologist wasn't confident in my treatment plan, so I sought care at Memorial Sloan Kettering. Though I dreaded going to the cancer center, I knew I had to do what was necessary to get better.

I delayed starting chemo until my oncologist set a firm date, and I finally underwent surgery to have my port put in. I prayed, "Jesus, please get me through this journey. I want to live." After four months of chemo, two lumpectomies, 25 rounds of radiation, and countless medical appointments, I am proud to say I'm a cancer survivor. I'm determined to keep living and never let this diagnosis define me.





MILLIE DAWKINS'S, JOURNEY

I started having pain in my lower left breast in October 2022. I received a mammogram that showed two cysts and then was recommended to have an ultrasound. The cysts were then removed that same month. In May of 2023 the cysts had returned. This time on my ultrasound the results showed two abnormal lumps. These lumps were under the muscle of my breast and were not easily identified at the time due to dense breast tissue. My doctor then suggested that I have a biopsy performed. 2 weeks later it was diagnosed as Stage 3 Breast Cancer. My chemotherapy treatment began on June 18, 2023.

My first chemotherapy treatment was not an easy feat and was a difficult time for me. My treatments were initially once a month but then shifted to weekly. The dosage was too high for me and brought great sickness, my doctors then recommended that they lower my treatment. In July 2023 I was hospitalized for the first time due to low vitamin levels which was a reaction to the chemotherapy. Treatments were manageable for me as I continued to work full-time until October 2023, where I was once again hospitalized due to blood clots. My last two months of treatments made me very lethargic at times but I still remained optimistic about surviving this journey.

In December I received my final chemotherapy treatment. In January of 2024, under the advice of my doctors I went through a full mastectomy of my left breast. As of April 19th I completed my last radiation treatment and am grateful for another chance at life. I'm grateful for the support of my family and friends throughout this journey, especially my daughter Shavone.



SONIA GAWAS'S, JOURNEY

Sonia is married to Ram Sarma for 17 years. Sonia is also a 9/11 survivor losing her first husband of 9 months and her high school sweetheart Ganesh Ladkat. She is a stay-at-home mom to Aadi, Isha and 2 dogs. She is a longtime volunteer in her town, be it PTA/PTSA, Girl Scout, Boy Scout, sports team boosters, you name it she is involved in all. Sonia is also the Councilwoman of West Windsor in her 2nd term.

One day in July of 2023 Sonia felt a lump in her right breast. After several doctor visits, various scans, biopsies, she was diagnosed with Malignant neoplasm in her right breast on August 17th, 2023.

It came as a big shock as there is no family history of any Cancer. She had been very regular with her mammograms, and was in between her 2 scans. Many other hospital visits for various other scans to follow.

On Sept 13th, Sonia underwent Lymph node biopsy surgery, which resulted in removal of 3 lymph nodes and she was diagnosed further at Stage 2 with HER2+. Next 2 weeks are several doctor visits, various more scans. And after celebrating her son's 15th birthday on Oct 2nd, on Oct 4th she underwent ort placement.

On Oct 12th, she started er journey of Chemotherapy, every 3 weeks for 6 sessions. She also chose to use the DigniCap therapy to help with the hair loss. Her sister Sophia Sangle and her soul sister Priti Umarkar took turns travelling from India to support her and her family.

After celebrating her daughter's birthday on March 9th, she undergoes yet another surgery on March 12th. This time it is the double Mastectomy. Her sister Sophia travels again from India this time with her daughter Durva to support Sonia and her family.

Sonia is doing well with her treatments. She still has one more post chemo infusion to go and then her reconstruction surgery is scheduled for November. Ram a volunteer Firefighter put everything on back seat, his work travels, responding to fire calls, etc. and stood by Sonia and their children to move through this tough journey together. Sophia and Priti who dropped everything and travelled across seas. All the neighbors, friends and her community who surrounded Sonia and her family, made going through this journey a breeze.

While going through this journey, Sonia was up for reelection during 2023 election. And to all the efforts she has put in the Township, she was reelected without much of canvassing as she was in chemo.



EBONY ROBINSON TOONE'S, JOURNEY

My name is Ebony Robinson-Toone and I am a 15 year Breast Cancer Survivor. I was diagnosed at the age of 30. I remember calling my mother and telling her that I was in so much pain under my left armpit that I was unable to put my bra on. She kept telling me to go to the Doctor, but I kept resisting. I had just married my husband at the time, and he kept insisting that I go to the Doctor as well. A month later, I built up the courage to go to my gynecologist. After checking my breast, he found a lump under my armpit near my left breast. Immediately he sent me for testing but because of my age, my insurance wouldn't cover a mammogram because of my age. They stated that 30 is too young, you are required at age 40 to get routine mammograms. After my Doctor fought for me, 3 months later I received my first mammogram. I remember I received the news about having breast cancer in my left breast on April 1st, 2009. Stage 2. From that day forward, my life has totally changed. After receiving a mastectomy of my left breast, I had 6 rounds of chemotherapy.

Physically I didn't look like I felt and mentally I was a wreck. I was a newlywed with a 2-year-old daughter, only 30 years old, and I felt so distraught and confused. But with the help of my Mother, Father, sisters, husband, friends, and most importantly God, I made it through.

Having Breast Cancer was also a blessing. It taught me to never take life for granted. It also taught me to pay attention to my body, and to stay healthy, and to take care of myself. My Mother was always my biggest cheerleader, cheering me on to fight when there were days I wanted to give up. Last year life went full circle when I was cheering my Mom to keep going and never to give up. I wish she were here by my side now continuing to cheer me on, but God had other plans and took her home. It will be a year in August that she passed, but I'm going to keep my promise to her to continue living and staying healthy and keep up on all my checkups. I'm so blessed to be here today to share this story. No matter what insurance companies and Doctors tell you. Continue to advocate for yourself because I did and It saved my life.



FERLIE ALMONTE'S JOURNEY

My world was shaken and transformed following routine mammograms.

I had no lumps. What I had were microcalcifications. Its powdery nature makes it undetectable to touch. When those particles increased in number and lined up in the duct, the radiologist recommended a stereotactic biopsy. It was cancer. Triple positive. I bombarded my breast oncology surgeon with questions. One of them was "Doctor, how much down time are we looking here? Because I have a busy 2022" She laughed and said that she loves how positively distracted I was because 90% of my healing will come from positivity. I wasted no time. My mother died of ovarian cancer, so I did want to take any chances. I opted for double mastectomy with breast reconstruction, followed by twelve rounds of chemo, a year long immunotherapy by infusion, and a five year regimen of hormone therapy. I had a horrific allergic reaction to taxol used for my chemotherapy that sent me to the ER. I was switched to a different drug and I responded well. With God's grace and the love, care and support that surrounded me, I magnificently survived and thrived through chemo, immunotherapy, three surgeries, four hospitalizations, including one to Covid, and ongoing hormone therapy. I have accomplished so much in two years realizing life is short and fragile. I decided to live a life that's joyful, meaningful and impactful for others to learn from. I shared my weekly journey of treatments on social media. POSITIVITY through ADVERSITY was my constant mantra. My faith was intensified. My Resilience SuperPower was uncaged! I refused to let my diagnosis define me. I was determined to MAKE MY INSPIRING STORY MY LEGACY. So, after completing treatments, I competed in a pageant for the first

time in my life, won and made history as the first Asian to win Ms. NJ Senior America in the pageant's 40 year history, finishing Top 5 out of 49 at the Nationals, published my fifth book, and got deeply involved in community service to exemplify that THERE'S HOPE AND BRIGHT LIFE AFTER CANCER. And we can CHOOSE TO MAKE OUR MESS OUR MESSAGE.






Sheila Marie Johnson Resilience and Representation
